# STORY BEHIND THE CANADA FLAG

### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Open the document called "<u>The Story Behind the Canadian Flag</u>". This document is located in the same folder as this assignment. Complete the following steps to the assignment to show your basic understanding of Microsoft Word.

- 1. Read and correct all the spelling and grammatical errors in this document. (5)
- 2. Set the title of the document as a "TITLE" preset style.
- 3. Set the section headings "Background" "Story" and "Conclusion" as "Heading 1" preset style.
- 4. Insert a preset cover page at the start of the document. And style it to fit the story.
- 5. Insert a blank page after the cover page and before the story. (Your document should now be 3 pages in length)
- 6. Set the line spacing as 1.5 for the story.
- 7. Insert the page number at the top right corner of each page with your last name in the page number.
- 8. Insert a footer in the document set as "Last Name 10 BBT"
- 9. Set the margins on the page to .75 all around.
- 10. Using the "Replace" feature, find and replace all of the words "Canadian" with "National"
- 11. At the bottom of the page create a table with 3 columns and 6 rows. The Headings for each column should be "Canadian Flag", "Years of Use" and "Flag Image". Set the column headings as "Heading 1" preset style.
- 12. The final table should look as such: (There is a folder with each of these Images CLICK HERE)

13. Insert the Current Canadian Flag in the top right corner of your main story on Page 3 with a drop shadow. It should look like this:

## The Story Behind the Canadian Flag

### Background

George Stanley, a Calgary-born historian, educator and soldier, was Dean of Arts at the Royal Military College in Kingston when he submitted his maple leaf design during a nationwide search for a new flag in 1964.

Prime Minister Lester Pearson believed Canada needed a new flag as a symbol to unite its people, those of French and English ancestry and from everywhere else in the world



#### Story

It was a dangerous venture. Governments had retreated hastily from previous attempts, 1925 and 1945, in the face of public opposition.

- 14. On your blank page 2, click on the top of it and using the built in function, have Microsoft Word create a table of contents for the document.
- 15. Publish as PDF in your Word folder
- 16. Save this in User Drive/10 BBT/Word as Corrected Canadian Flag.docx
